

Commas to Separate a Series Worksheet

Commas you use in writing are similar to pauses you use in speech. Commas are also used to group similar items together.

Directions:

1. Add commas to separate the series of words, phrases, or clauses.

Example: I like to walk run and play sports.

Answer: I like to walk, run, and play sports.

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2. There were soldiers of the guard agents of the king and nobles of the land looking for Arthur.
