Adjective → description

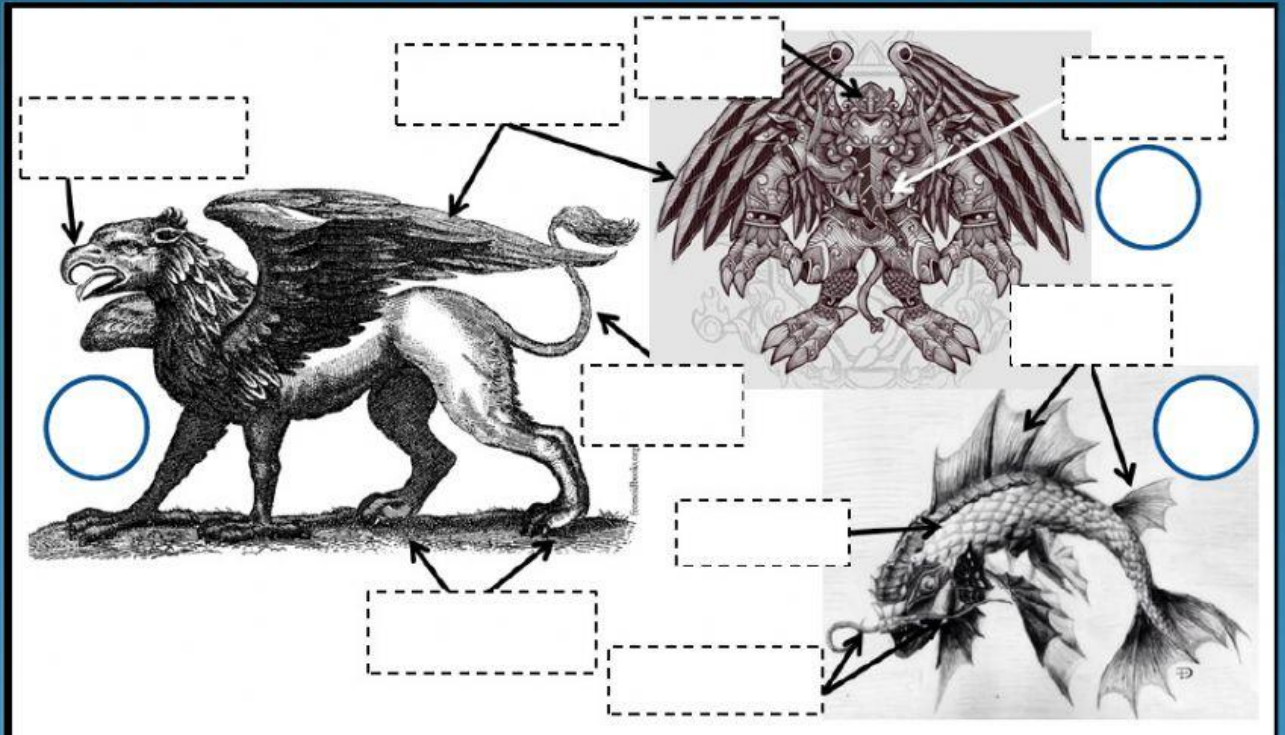
Pronoun → avoid repeating the name
