

# 5a Twenty Thousand Leagues Under the Sea



Jules Gabriel Verne (1828-1905) was born in Nantes, France. As a young man, he studied law in Paris, but then he decided to become a writer. He published his first novel *Five Weeks in a Balloon* in 1863, and *Journey to the Centre of the Earth* in 1864. Other famous novels include *Twenty Thousand Leagues Under the Sea* (1870) and *Around the World in Eighty Days* (1873). Verne liked writing adventure stories and was very imaginative. He wrote about inventions like submarines, television and spaceships. This was in the 1860s when such
