_____ - a description of what is required in order to enter university, community college or a training program

_____ - the process of determining a student's skills and level

_____ - a formal training program for people who want to work in a skilled trade; people learn by alternating between learning by working at their trade and learning by being in a college.

_____ - Financial award to a college/university student made primarily on the basis of financial need or some other criterion in addition to academic ability

_____ - where men and women study or live in the same place e.g. all programs are co-ed; almost all college and university residences are co-ed.

_____ - a Co-operative program places the student with an employer to practice their skills and knowledge in real-life experiences in addition to regular classroom studies.

_____ - a public post-secondary educational institution that offers a variety of programs to high-school graduates and adults seeking further education or employment training

_____ - Students earn 1 credit when they successfully complete a subject or course of a set number of hours. A minimum of 30 credits is needed to graduate from high school in Ontario.

_____ - evidence of person's academic achievements usually in the form of certificates, diplomas and degrees.

_____ - the official description of each course and what must be learnt from it.

_____ - the conditions which a student must meet in order to enter a program/course

_____ - refers to what you must complete before you can be considered for admission to a specific program. E.g. Grade 12 University Level Biology is a prerequisite to a Nursing Program.

_____ - a place where a student can live on or off-campus

_____ - payment from the funds of a private person or group, school, university, government, etc. to pay for a student's education, awarded on the basis of high marks (scholarly (academic) achievement)

_____ - the official record of student's studies, course and grades. It is sent to a college, university or training program when applying to enter those programs.
