Three-part phrasal verbs consist of one VERB and two PARTICLES.

to get on with, to walk out on, to fit in with, etc.

Three-part phrasal verbs are all TRANSITIVE - they all need an OBJECT, which always goes AFTER two particles.

Benjamin meets Daisy and gets on with her very well.

In questions all three parts of the verb stay together.
