The redback spider It is one of the deadliest spiders in the world. They are very common in Australia, especially in urban areas – they love human company! (Not so) fun fact: If they bite you, you have three hours to get to a hospital... 	In fact, thanks to the anti-venom (found in 1979), redback spiders rarely kill. They actually haven't killed anyone since 1979... which doesn't mean they haven't bitten! 	The crocodile There are two species of crocodiles: freshwater crocodiles and saltwater crocodiles. Saltwater crocs are the biggest, heaviest and most dangerous, and can even be found off beaches! (Not so) fun fact: To kill their victims, crocodiles drag them under water and drown them. 	There are no more than two deaths per year. 
The great white shark About 180 species of sharks inhabit the deep waters around Australia. The largest, strongest and most ferocious is the great white shark. Fun fact: sharks need to swim, or they will sink! 	959 shark attacks have happened in Australia since 1791, but "only" 227 have been fatal. 	The box jellyfish It is one of the most lethal jellyfish – a person can go into cardiac arrest within minutes. Fun fact: It has 15 tentacles (3 meters long), 24 eyes, 4 brains and... 60 anuses! 	The box jellyfish has stung 64 people to death since 1884.
