It also would help to organize lunch lines in the cafeteria so they are shorter and move more quickly.

Students, teachers, staff, and parents should work together to plan a healthy eating program. The program would eliminate unhealthy foods and give us more healthy choices. We need more fresh fruits, vegetables, and salads. We should have sandwiches on whole-grain breads with lean meats like turkey, chicken, ham, and tuna fish. We should also have low-fat dairy products like yogurt and low-fat cheeses. Fried foods such as French fries, fried chicken, and fish sticks should be replaced with baked potatoes, chicken, or fish.
