- We use **should** for ...
necessity possibility advice
- We use **must** for ...
necessity advice ability
- We use **don't / doesn't have to** for ...
prohibition unnecessary impossibility
- We use **could, may** and **might** for ...
necessity possibility obligation
- Sometimes **mustn't** is the same as ...
don't have to may not can't
- Choose the same idea **"It's possible that I pass my exam"**
I will pass my exam.
I may pass my exam.
I can pass my exam.
- Choose the same idea **"It's prohibited to smoke here"**
You can't smoke here.
You don't have to smoke here.
You may not smoke here.
- Choose the same idea **"It isn't necessary to take an umbrella"**
You can't take an umbrella.
You don't have to take an umbrella.
You mustn't take an umbrella.
- Choose the idea to complete the sentence: "The vaccination has been tested hundreds of times."
It can be safe. It must be safe. It may be safe.
- You are eating too many pizzas. I think you ...eat much fast food.
