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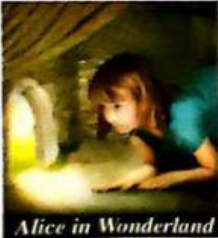

Fairy tales are usually short stories for children. They aren't true stories. They are often about things that can't happen in real life. Children love them and parents usually enjoy them too.

The characters in fairy tales are often princes and princesses, giants (ענקים / عمالقة) or kings and queens. Not all fairy tales have fairies or magic in them. Sometimes fairy tales are about animals that can talk. The heroes in fairy tales are usually good and brave characters. They are also beautiful or good-looking (נאים / جميلون, وسماء). The villains are the bad characters and are often ugly. Fairy tales often begin with the words "Once upon a time" and usually have a happy ending.

Many years ago, people told (סיפור / حكا) fairy tales – they didn't write them in books. There are many fairy tales that people tell around the world. They have the same plot, but the characters have different names.

10 do they do? They run around in the sun and play games. They don't go into the forest.

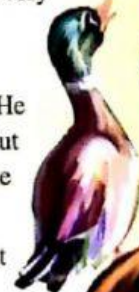
