Sam: Glad to meet you, Tine. You play soccer, don't you?

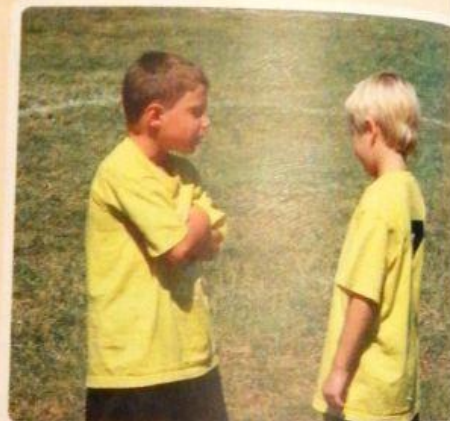
Tine: Yes, but name here in Europe is football, though.
