Sharks and orcas have a lot in common. Both of these sea animals are carnivores (meat-eaters) that hunt for their food. Like most fish, sharks lay eggs. But orca babies are born live and drink milk from their mothers. Another difference is that orcas have bony skeletons, but sharks have no bones at all - only cartilage!

You can make a realistic – looking volcano erupt in your kitchen! Set a clean soda bottle inside a pan or tray. (This will make it easier to clean up after your eruption.) Use a funnel to put 2 tablespoons of baking soda in the bottle. Add a few drops of red food coloring, too. Then, pat damp dirt or sand around the bottle to make a volcano shape. Now you’re ready for the eruption. Just pour a cup of vinegar into the bottle and watch what happens!

Disappearing Forests

People use trees for many things, including lumber for building and wood for fuel. When we only cut some trees, more can grow. But sometimes trees are cut faster than they can grow back. The forest animals lose their homes. Without trees, rainwater doesn’t soak into the ground. As a result, the rain washes dirt into streams. New trees cannot grow because there is no soil. Fish can’t live in the muddy water. Often, what was once a forest full of living things becomes a barren landscape.
