FUTURE PERFECT TENSE : will have + V3

FUTURE CONTINUOUS TENSE : will be + Ving

1. I am working now but next month this time I (enjoy) the sun on the beach
2. By the time you come office, everybody (leave)
3. Don't phone me before 8 o'clock, I (have) an important meeting
4. I have to hurry or else, I (not finish) the homework before teacher arrives
5. I don't think he (fix) the car by tomorrow
6. She will be on holiday so she (not work) this time next week

PHRASAL VERBS WITH OUT

HEAD OUT: Go out, leave a place

FIND OUT: Discover some information.

WORK OUT: End in a good way.

COME OUT: To become known, to come into public view, to debut

PHASE OUT: Remove gradually
