

SECOND CONDITIONAL



"if" clause	main clause
<u>If</u> I <i>won</i> a million dollars,	... I <i>would</i> put the money in a bank. ... I <i>could</i> buy an airplane. ... I <i>might</i> give it all away.
main clause	"if" clause
I <i>would</i> put the money in a bank I <i>could</i> buy an airplane I <i>might</i> give it all away	... <u>if</u> I <i>won</i> a million dollars.



NOTES:

- (1) The second conditional is used to talk about future events that are hypothetical or improbable.
(2) To form negative sentences, add 'not' after 'would', 'could' and 'might'. *Eg. I might not give it all away.*
