COMPARATIVES AND SUPERLATIVES STRUCTURES

We use <u>as + adjective + as</u> two compare two things that are equal.



Kevin is as tall as his father now.

- We use <u>not as + adjective + as</u> to compare two things that are not equal.
 Running isn't as dangerous as climbing.
- We can also compare two people or things that are not equal by using:

- <u>adjective + -er + than</u> ...or... <u>more + adjective + than</u>

My computer is newer than yours.

Elena's cellphone is more expensive than Carlos'.

- To compare three or more things, we use superlatives.
 - The + adjective + -est ...or... the most + adjective

Today was the worst day of my life.

This is the most peaceful place I've ever been.
