Read and study the following addition explanation about "Present Perfect Tense" to help you more understand about this material!

✚ Present Perfect Tense indicates:

1. An action that happened in an indefinite time in the past (suatu perbuatan/peristiwa yang terjadi di waktu yang tidak bisa ditentukan di waktu lampau)

Examples:

- John has travelled around the world. (We don't know when)
- She has never met the manager.

2. An action that happened more than one in the past (Suatu perbuatan/peristiwa yang terjadi lebih dari satu kali di waktu lampau)

Examples:

- I have visited Bali three times
- Jeane has read the book many times

3. An action that has recently occurred (Suatu kegiatan/peristiwa yang baru saja terjadi)

Examples:

- We have just arrived here.
- Maya has just gone to the office.

4. An action that happened repeatedly before now (Suatu perbuatan/peristiwa yang terjadi berulang kali di waktu lampau)

Examples:

- I have always seen him on the bus stop at 7 o'clock
- We have usually been at school until late night

5. An action that began in the past and is still occurring in the present (Suatu perbuatan/peristiwa yang dimulai di waktu lampau dan masih terjadi sampai saat ini)

Examples:

- Brenda has lived in Surabaya for 5 years
- John and Jeni have lived in the same house since 1970

- ✚ The sentence structure/form of Present Perfect Tense are:

Formula:

- (+) Subject + have/has + Verb₃ +**
- (-) Subject + haven't/hasn't + Verb₃ +**
- (?) Have/has + Subject + Verb₃ +**

Note:

Subjects : I, you, we, they and plural form use 'have'

Subjects : He, she, it, singular form use 'has'

- ✚ The language features (characteristics) of Present Perfect tense:

1. Use Verb 3

- There are both regular and irregular verbs:
 - a. Regular Verb 3 (kata kerja beraturan)

Verb 1	Verb 3
Close	Closed
Turn	Turned
Play	Played
Study	Studied
Visit	Visited

b. Irregular Verb 3 (kata kerja tidak beraturan)

Verb 1	Verb 3
Eat	Eaten
Write	Written
Read	Read
Sleep	Slept
Cut	Cut

2. Use adverb of time "For" and "Since"

- ✓ Use 'for' + duration of time: *for* five years, *for* five hours, *for* ten minutes

Example:

I have watched TV *for* ten minutes

- ✓ Use 'since' + beginning time: *since* 1970, *since* five o'clock, *since* January, *since* two hours ago

Example:

I have watched TV *since* this morning

3. Use the word "Already" or "Yet"

- ✓ 'Already' is used to indicate that something has happened. It is used in affirmative/positive sentence

Example:

I have *already* done my homework

- ✓ 'Yet' is used to indicate that something hasn't happened. It is used in negative sentence

Example:

I haven't done my homework *yet*

4. Use adverbial words "Just (baru saja)", "Ever (pernah)", "Never (tidak pernah)"
