

Out of the Classroom

“Homeschooling” is a term for the education of children who do not go to school. It is done in many different ways in many countries. It is illegal in some, such as Germany and Sweden, and most popular by far in the United States, where today there are two million children schooled at home. The most common reasons that parents give for homeschooling are concerns about the negative or even dangerous environment in schools, the lack of religious or moral instruction and the poor quality of teaching. So far it has proven effective for all sorts of children, from the abnormally intelligent to those with learning disabilities.

Many people believe that homeschooling parents simply use normal school books to teach their children at home. Some do this and others buy a learning plan from a company that specialises in homeschooling programmes. But, in fact, parents and their children can do what they want, provided they follow the regulations of the state where they live.

Homeschooling children usually must complete a specific number of hours in specific subjects. There is no homeschooling diploma, but some children choose to take an equivalency exam or other common tests that prove they are ready for university-level studies. And universities eagerly accept homeschoolers, knowing them to be highly motivated, independent and competent learners.

Critics say that homeschooling can lead to a very limited education and a one-sided world view. Certainly, the quality of this education depends to a large extent on the intelligence, skills and dedication of the parents or the tutors they hire for their children.
