## **WOULD RATHER**

The verb phrase would rather is equivalent in meaning to prefer. We can use it to:

- A) talk about preferences for ourselves (would rather + infinitive without to)
- B) talk about preferences for other people (would rather + subject + past tense)

*The verb go is used as an example	
A) I/You/He/She/We/They'd rather	GO* BY MYSELF
	NOT GO BY MYSELF
B) I/You/He/She/We/They'd rather you	STAYED AT HOME
	DIDN'T GO OUT
