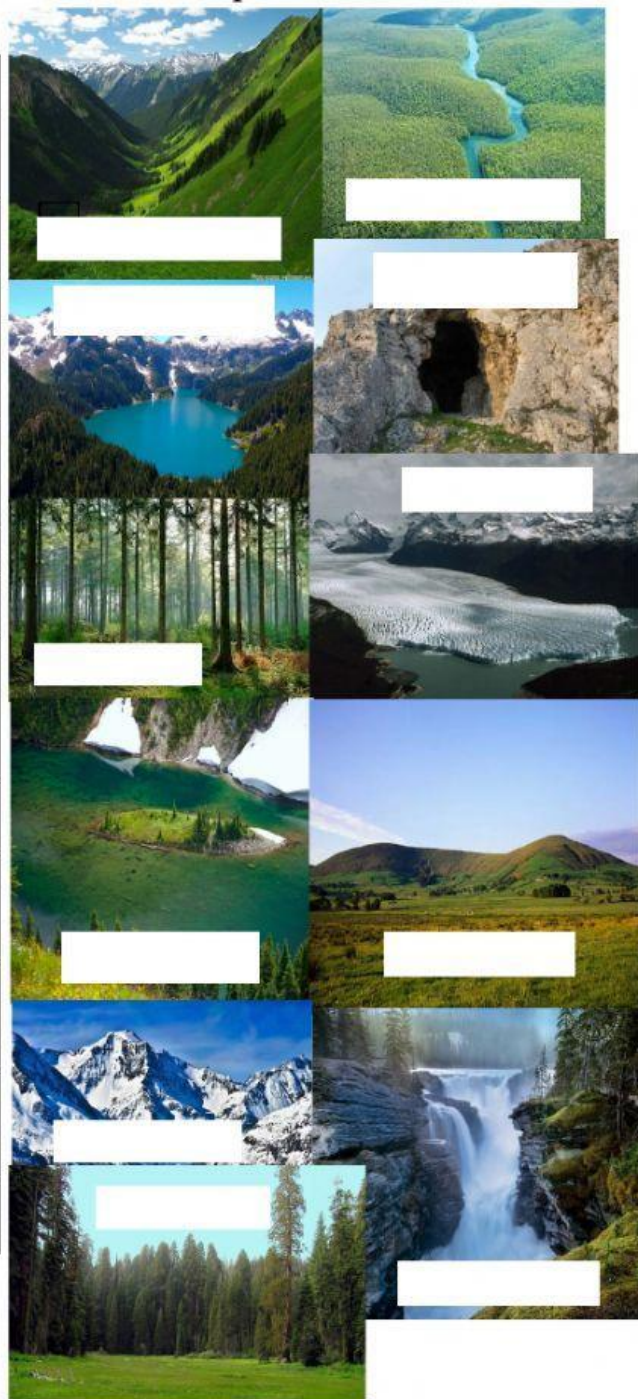


Exploring Nature

Jasper National Park is part of a very unique ecosystem. Located in the Canadian Rocky Mountains, the landscape is beautifully dramatic. From the peaks of the mountains, to the crystal blue rivers, to the breathtaking valleys, Jasper shows everything Canada has to offer!

To begin, it's important to know the vocabulary we will be using. Match each vocabulary word (with the description) to the correct photo.

Waterfall - a cascade of water falling from a height, formed when a river or stream flows over an edge or steep hill.
Island - a piece of land surrounded by water.
Valley - a low area of land between hills or mountains, typically with a river or stream flowing through it.
Hill - a naturally raised area of land, not as high or rough as a mountain.
River - a large natural stream of water flowing in a channel to the sea, a lake, or another such stream.
Glacier - a slowly moving mass or river of ice formed by the accumulation and compaction of snow on mountains.
Mountain - a large steep hill.
Forest - a large area covered mainly with trees and other plants.
Meadow - a piece of grassland, usually surrounded by trees.
Cave - a large underground chamber in a hillside or cliff
Lake - a large body of water surrounded by land.
