Tom Longboat

Tom Longboat was a member of the First Nations* and a famous long-distance* runner. He was born in Ontario, Canada, on June 4, 1887. He grew up in a poor family on a farm, and his father died when Tom was five. When he was a child, he didn't like school. At that time, Canadian schools didn't want the First Nations people to speak their own languages.

In 1901, Tom heard about Bill Davis, a member of the First Nations who won second place in the Boston Marathon. Because of Bill, Tom started to run, too. In 1905, Tom ran his first race, and only two years later he won the Boston Marathon. He finished almost five minutes faster than anyone else.

Tom won many races in his life, so he was a very successful runner. However, in 1916, he decided to stop entering races and help Canada in World War I.* Tom was a strong runner, so he carried important messages for the army. His job was to carry them quickly between army posts* in France.

After the war ended in 1918, Tom went back to Canada and stopped running. He lived and worked in Toronto until 1944, and then he moved back to his hometown. He died in January 1949 when he was 61 years old. Six years later, Canada decided that Tom Longboat should become a member of Canada's Sports Hall of Fame. This is a special group of famous Canadian people in sports. Today, Tom Longboat is still remembered as Canada's best long-distance runner.
