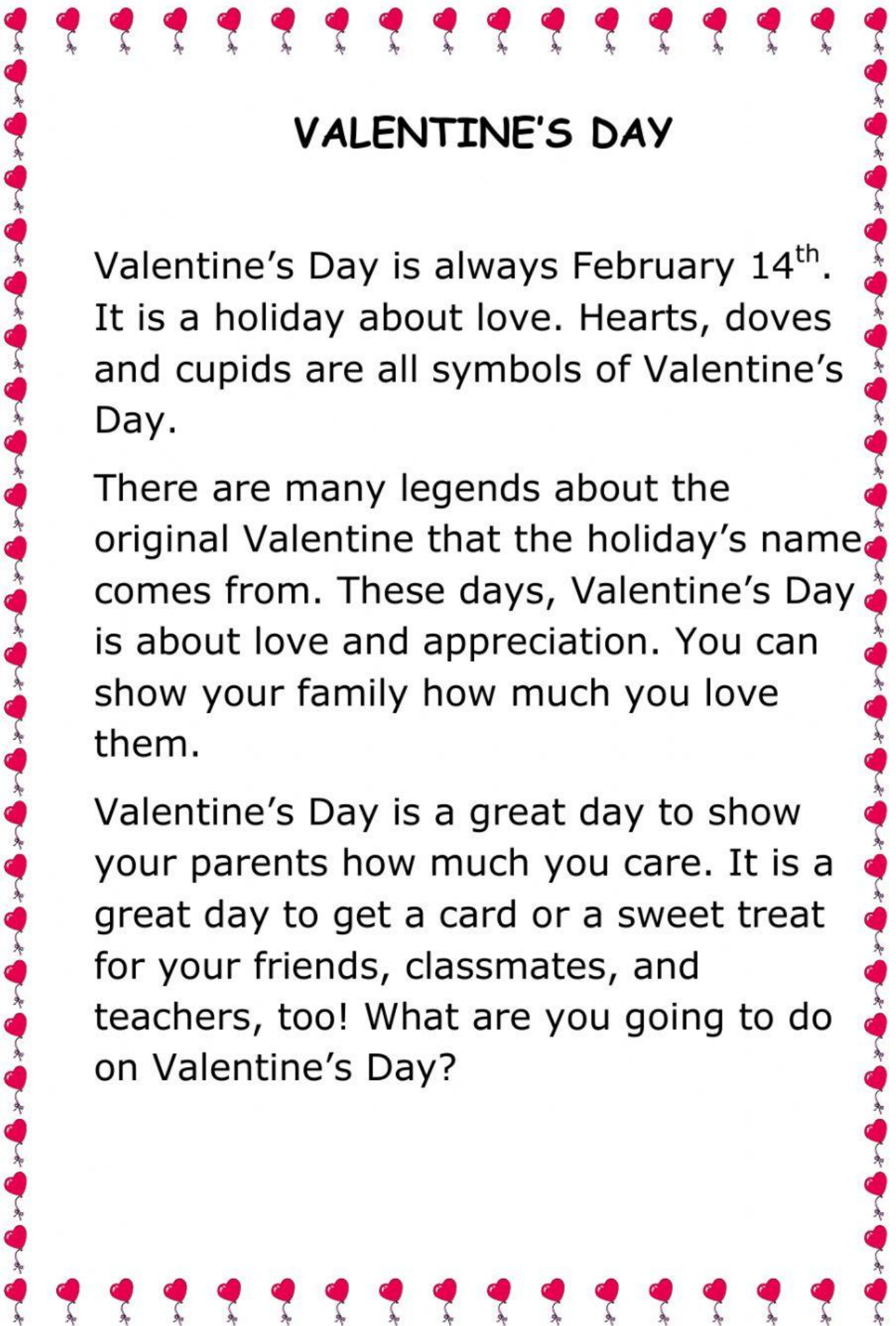




VALENTINE'S DAY

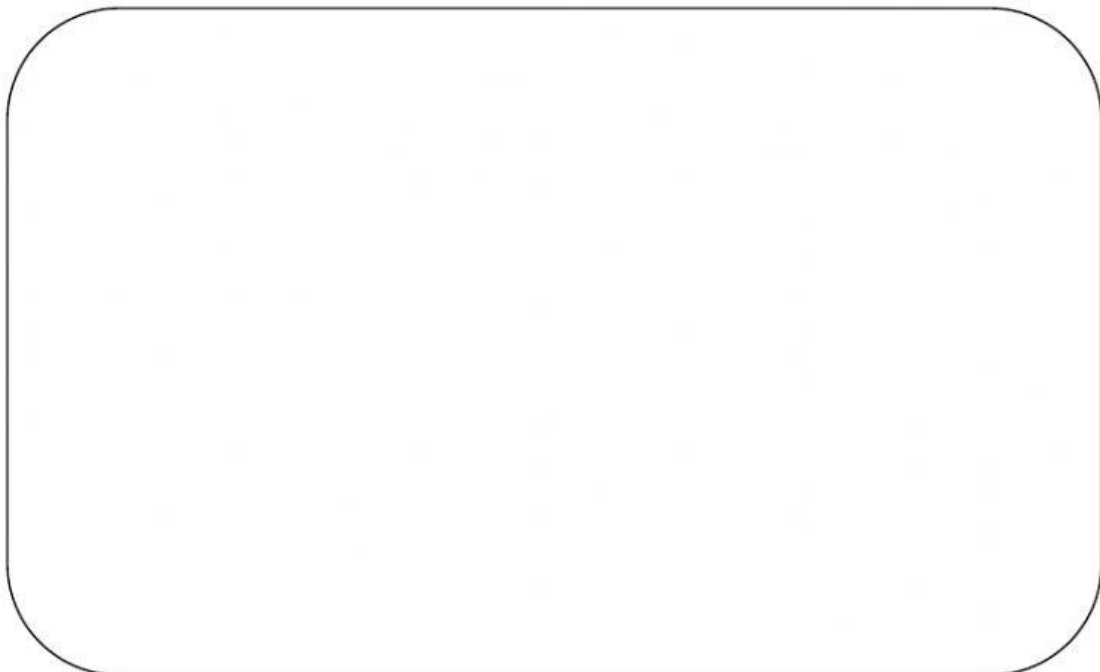
