

## PAST MODALS OF DEDUCTION

To make guesses/speculate about the past we use:

### MODAL VERB + HAVE + PAST PARTICIPLE (-ED/3<sup>rd</sup> verb form)

example:

I saw Simon in a police car last night. The police **MUST HAVE ARRESTED** him → **I'm sure it happened**

The teacher **CAN'T HAVE MARKED** our homework, she hasn't got our notebooks with her → **it's impossible/I'm sure it didn't happen**

There **MIGHT HAVE BEEN/COULD HAVE BEEN** an accident in the town centre. There was a big traffic jam → **it's possible/perhaps it happened**

6. I'm positive you've heard Helen's joke about the dog\*.

You \_\_\_\_\_ Helen's joke about the dog.

\*dog joke:

How would you call a dog with no legs?

It doesn't matter, it won't come anyway.
