Jit = Usually a kid, but it can be anyone younger than you :)

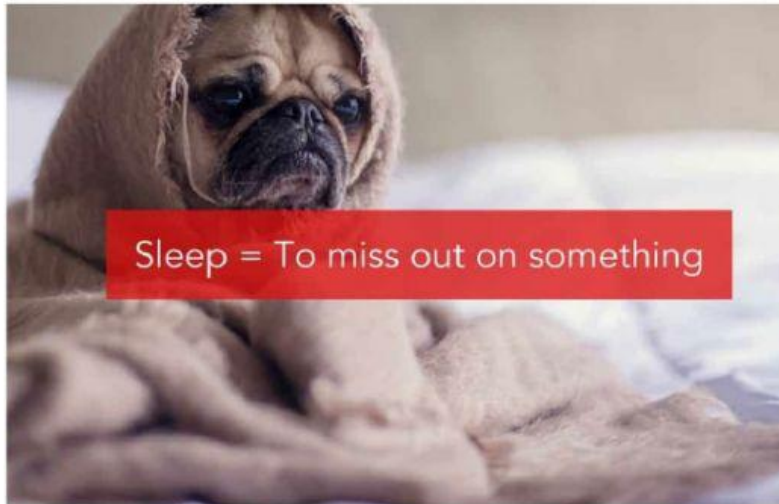
Kids in the class below you? Jits.
