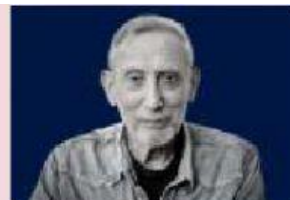




What Internet dating slang do you know?

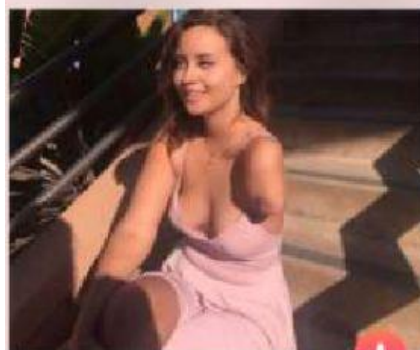

Peter, on the other hand, is a Postgraduate student at Manchester.

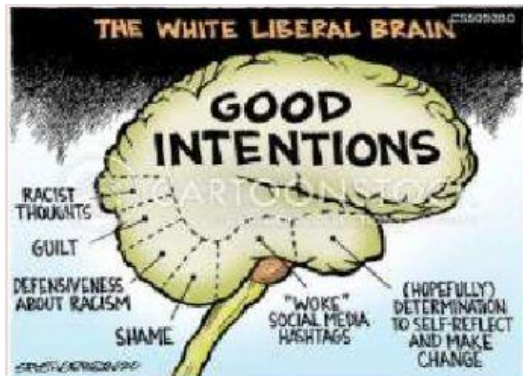
His bio confirms his status as an international man of mystery.

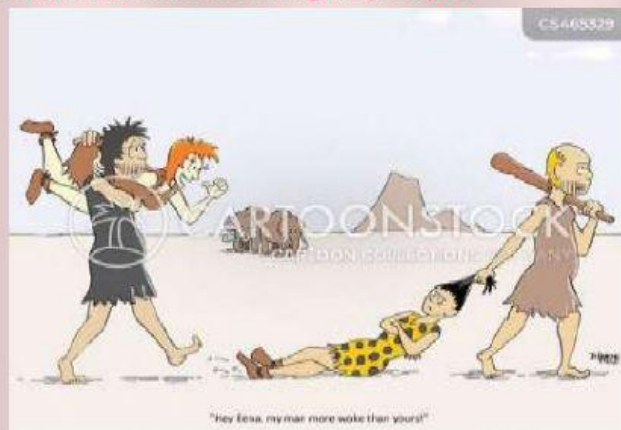
