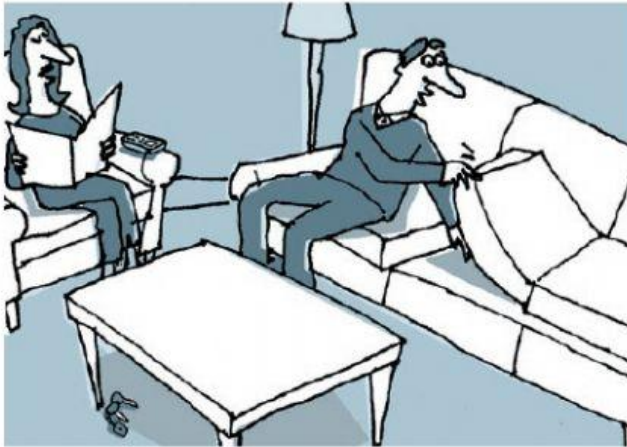




Man: Where's the phone?

Affirmative + preposition

It's	on	the chair.
They're		the table.

TIP Use *the* (definite article) with both singular and plural nouns: *the phone, the keys*.

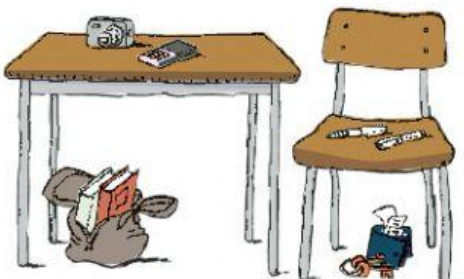
