Baby Katelyn is the latest child of Jeni and Ray Bonell of Queensland, Australia. They have sixteen children—seven girls and nine boys.

Life in the Bonell house is noisy, but they have rules so things don't get too crazy. The house has seven bedrooms, but each child sleeps in his or her own bed. Jesse and Brooke, the two oldest kids, don't live with the family. They have their own homes in the neighborhood, but they often visit.

Jeni says that having a big family is normal for them. Her day-to-day life is similar to the life of other moms, just with more washing to do and bigger meals to cook. Food shopping costs about \$600 a week. Meals and house cleaning are big jobs, but all the children help from the age of eight. Giving each of their children enough time and attention isn't easy, but it's important for both parents. "Jeni and Ray spend so much time with the kids," says a family friend. "The kids definitely feel loved and happy, and the new baby is beautiful."
