

EMIGRATION

From the earliest times people have moved from their home to find a new home elsewhere. This movement of people is called emigration. Sometimes wars forced people to emigrate or they emigrated because of religious or political beliefs. For example, in the 20th century many thousands of people from central Europe escaped from their home country because of the cruelties of the Nazis. When new lands were discovered, like the American continent followed by South Africa, Australia, and New Zealand, thousands of people emigrated from older areas. They did so because they could no longer make a good living in their own countries or because they wanted better opportunities or for love of adventure. In today's world there is still emigration. Canada mostly need nurses and school teachers. Australia still needs thousand of skilled and unskilled workers. Although wages are good here, living conditions can be hard, primitive and lonely for immigrants. There are wide possibilities for emigration, but Commonwealth countries wish to select the people who come in to them. For instance, they generally prefer Europeans to Asians. And if somebody is planning to emigrate, they should make full inquiries about the land, the government, the climate, the language and the living and working conditions of the country before they leave their home.
