A Somebody / Something / Somewhere

(somebody, something, somewhere)는 긍정문 또는 의문문에 쓴다.

Somebody broke the window. Did **somebody** break the window?

(누군가가 창문을 깨뜨렸는데, 누가 그랬는지 모른다.)

There is **something** on the table. Is there **something** on the table?

(탁자 위에 물건이 하나 놓여있는데, 무엇인지 모른다.)

Let's go **somewhere** today. Can we go **somewhere** today?

(오늘 어디엔가 가자고 말하는 데, 정확히 어디인지는 모른다.)

B Anybody / Anything / Anywhere

(anybody, anything, anywhere)는 의문문 또는 부정문에 쓴다.

(의문문) Do you know **anybody** in your class?

Is there **anything** in your pocket?

Do you want to go **anywhere** today?

(부정문) I'm a new student. I don't know **anybody** in my class.

There isn't **anything** in my pocket. It's empty.

I'm tired. I don't want to go **anywhere** today.

C Nobody / Nothing / Nowhere

(nobody, nothing, nowhere)는 부정의 뜻을 갖는다.

There is **nobody** in the classroom. = There **isn't anybody** in the classroom.

There is **nothing** under the sofa. = There **isn't anything** under the sofa.

I'm going **nowhere**. = I'm **not** going **anywhere**.
