Sam really just wanted a warm bath and breakfast, but he thought about sunny beaches. He thought about a picnic with bread and cheese and Italian wine.

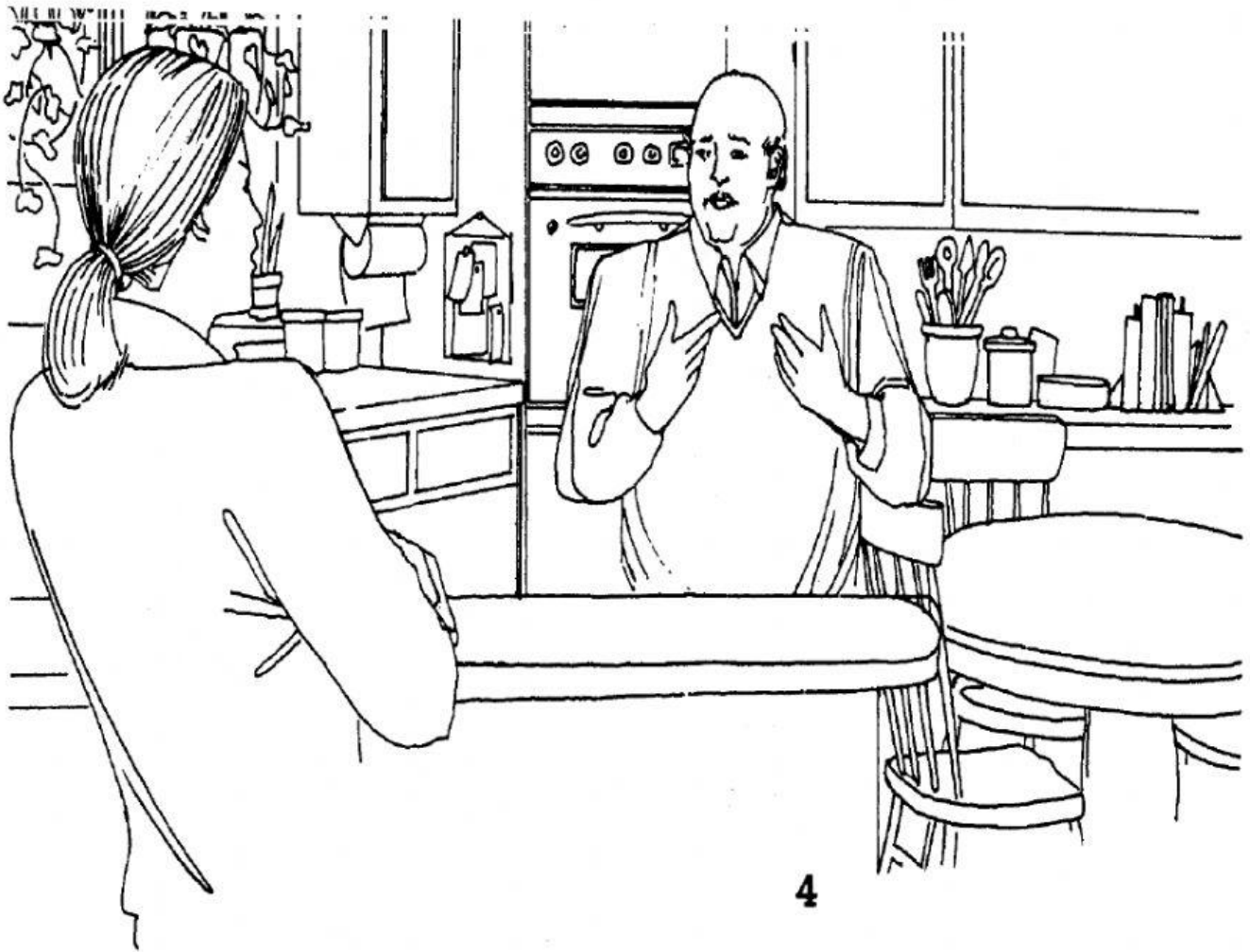
"Let's go to Italy," he said to Susan when they got home. "Everyone says the food is wonderful and the people are very friendly."
