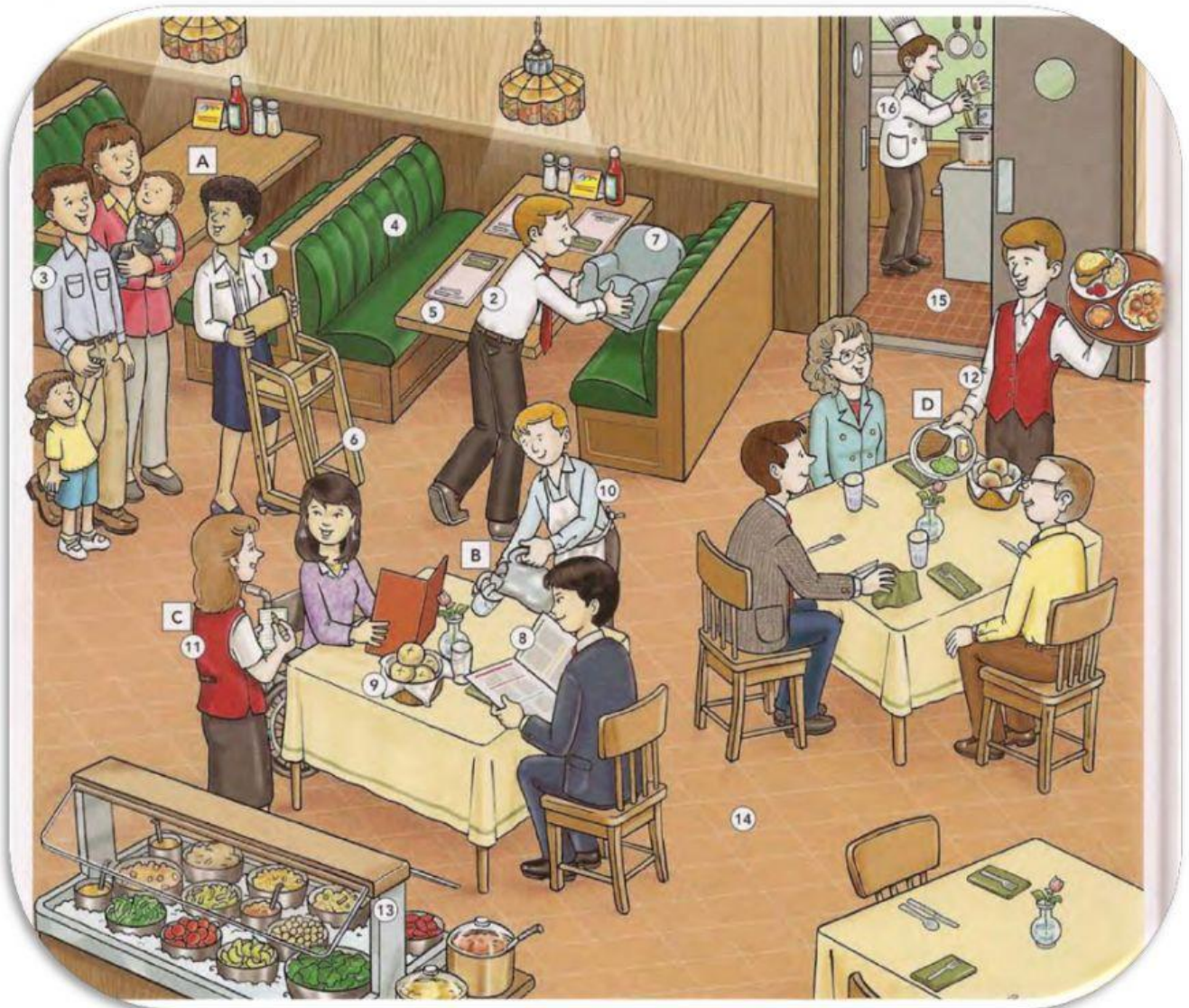

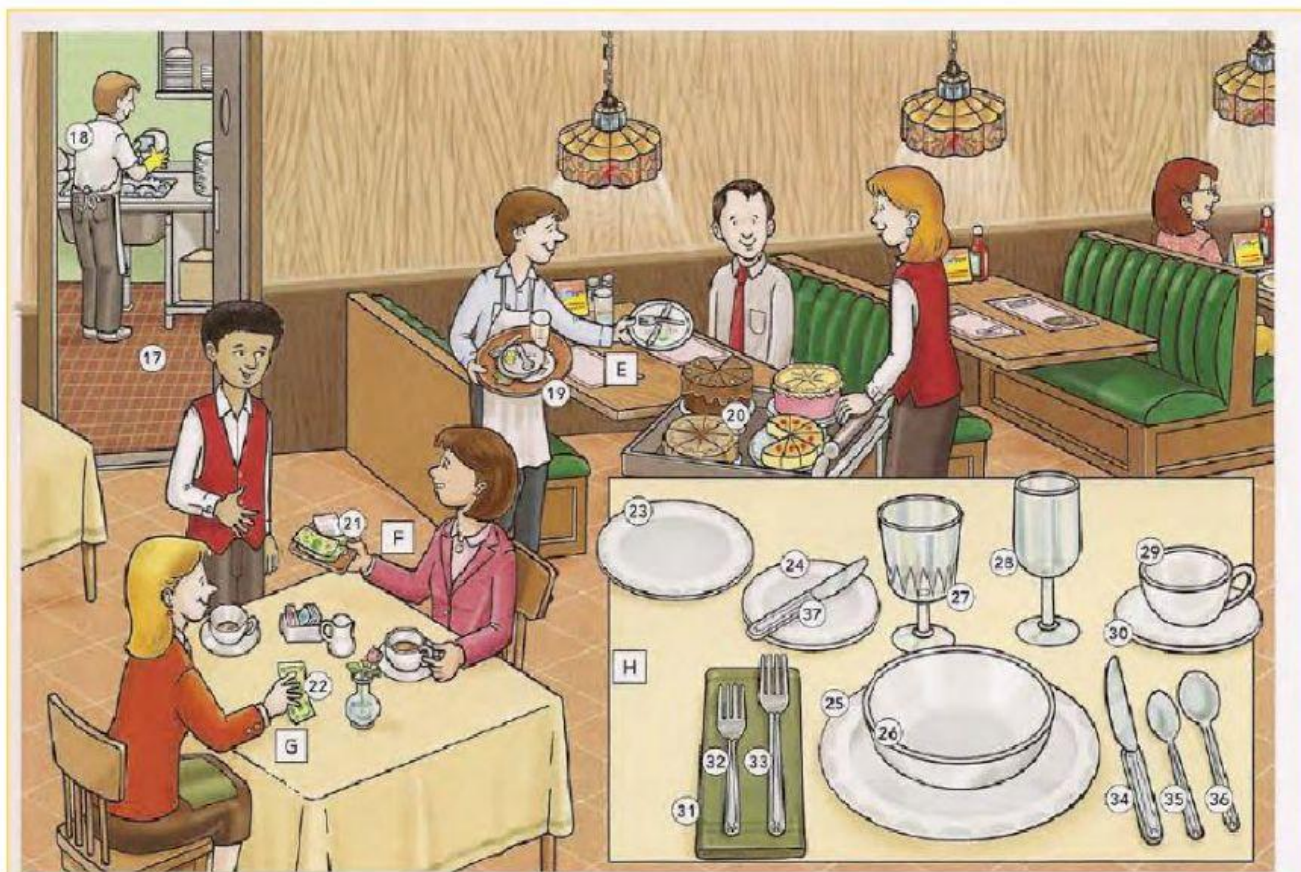

Taking notes about the order: ⇒ Would you like to order? ⇒ Can I help you? ⇒ Are you ready to order? ⇒ Are you going to try any of our...? Offering Food ⇒ Would you like a / an / some...? ⇒ What about a / an / some...? ⇒ Can I get you a / an / some...? ⇒ Won't you go for a / an / some...? Asking about preferences: ⇒ Do you prefer...? ⇒ How would you like it? Asking about drinks: ⇒ What would you like to drink? ⇒ Anything to drink? ⇒ To drink?	Ordering a meal: ⇒ Excuse me, waiter, we'd like to order. ⇒ We are ready to order now. ⇒ I'd like a / an / some...and... ⇒ I want a / an / some...and... ⇒ I'll go for a / an / some... ⇒ Please bring me a / an / some... To accept / refuse the offer: ⇒ Yes, please. ⇒ No, thanks. I'd like/ prefer a / an / some... Deciding about drinks: ⇒ I'd like... ⇒ Could you bring me..., please? Asking about the bill: ⇒ Could I have the bill, please? ⇒ Could you bring me the bill, please?
