Britain is different!

1 The British Tourist Board is, at the moment, trying to sell one big idea to British people: *Don't go abroad for your holiday this summer.* To make **its** message clear, it has come up with a slogan that is simple and effective: *No passport, no visa, no euros.* There is even a new word in the English language to describe staying at home for your holidays – *staycation* – which combines the verb *stay* and the American word for holidays, *vacation*. The Tourist Board sincerely hopes that staycation will become the word of the summer.

On the one hand, it was the Diamond Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth, and on the other hand, the Olympic Games were taking place in London. Many stars are working with the tourist board to push Britain as a holiday destination. One of **them** is Rupert Grint, the red-haired boy from the Harry Potter films. As he says in an advert, *Why go surfing on Bondi beach (in Australia), when you can do the same thing at Bridlington Beach (in the north of England).*

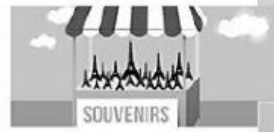
