Have got	Have
(+) They've got a brother.	They have a brother.
(?) Have they got a brother?	Do they have a brother?
- Yes, they have.	- Yes, they do.
- No, they haven't.	- No, they don't.
(-) They haven't got any brothers.	They don't have any brothers.
(+) She's got long blonde hair.	She has long blonde hair.
(?) Has she got long blonde hair?	Does she have long blonde hair?
- Yes, she has.	- Yes, she does.
- No, she hasn't.	- No, she doesn't.
(-) She hasn't got long blonde hair.	She doesn't have long blonde hair.
