INTRODUCE PLACES

HAUNTED HOUSE

Personification (Give human qualities)

E.g The eerie windows of the house glared at us, warning us not to come near.

Use personification to describe the haunted house



HAUNTED HOUSE

Metaphor (Compare it to something else)

E.g The house with its eerie windows, was a predator waiting for innocent prey.

Use a metaphor

HAUNTED HOUSE

Simile (Compare it to something else using like or as)

E.g Hungry as a wolf, the house with its eerie windows was waiting for curious fools to trespass.

Use a simile



FORESHADOWING

Do not reveal but indicate what a reader can look forward to in your story.

E.g The day was swell and I was happy. Little did I know, something bad was waiting to happen.

Match the foreshadows
