World traveler

Jessica Nabongo is a blogger and photographer. And she loves visiting new places.

Jessica was born in 1984 in the United States. She lived and studied there and, when she finished college, she got a job in sales. But she was soon bored. She decided she wanted to live in another country, and so she moved to Japan to teach English. After a year in Japan, she moved to London.



Jessica then got a job in the United Nations. She learned a lot, but she wanted more: she wanted to travel again. In 2017, she went to Bali, Indonesia on vacation. She decided there that she wanted to visit every country in the world. She quit her job and traveled for the next two years. In 2019, she visited her last country—the Seychelles. She became the first Black woman to visit every country in the world.

Jessica is proud of this, but for her, traveling is not just about how many countries she visits. It's about the people she meets and what she learns.
