SPACE EXPLORATION

Space exploration aims to bring to light many questions about existence and survival. The exploration of outer space might offer an answer to humanity's dated query. 'Are we alone in the universe?' With the immensity of space and humans' limited means of exploring it, it is extremely difficult to prove or disapprove the existence of alien life. Some established institutions like the Search for Extraterrestrial Intelligence (SETI) aim to discover if there are other forms of life in the cosmos. Carl Sagan, a renowned astronomer, expressed in his belief of the possibility that humankind may not be alone in the universe.

Space exploration also allows humans to discover the infinite possibilities that they can create in outer space. Russia and the USA are among the first countries to explore such possibilities in space exploration. Personalities who have played major roles in early space exploration include Konstantin Tsiolkovsky and Wernher von Braun. Tsiolkovsky was a Soviet Russian rocket scientist who deemed that man will ultimately be able to conquer outer space. Von Braun, a German rocket engineer who helped man to reach the moon with the successful launch and return of Apollo 11, believed that man can go wherever he wants, even outer space.

Several nations, science experts and interested individuals know that it is important to gain knowledge about outer space. Institutions such as the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) are geared towards discovering something in space that may enhance man's knowledge and offer answers to man's questions on whether or not we are alone in the infinite cosmos.
