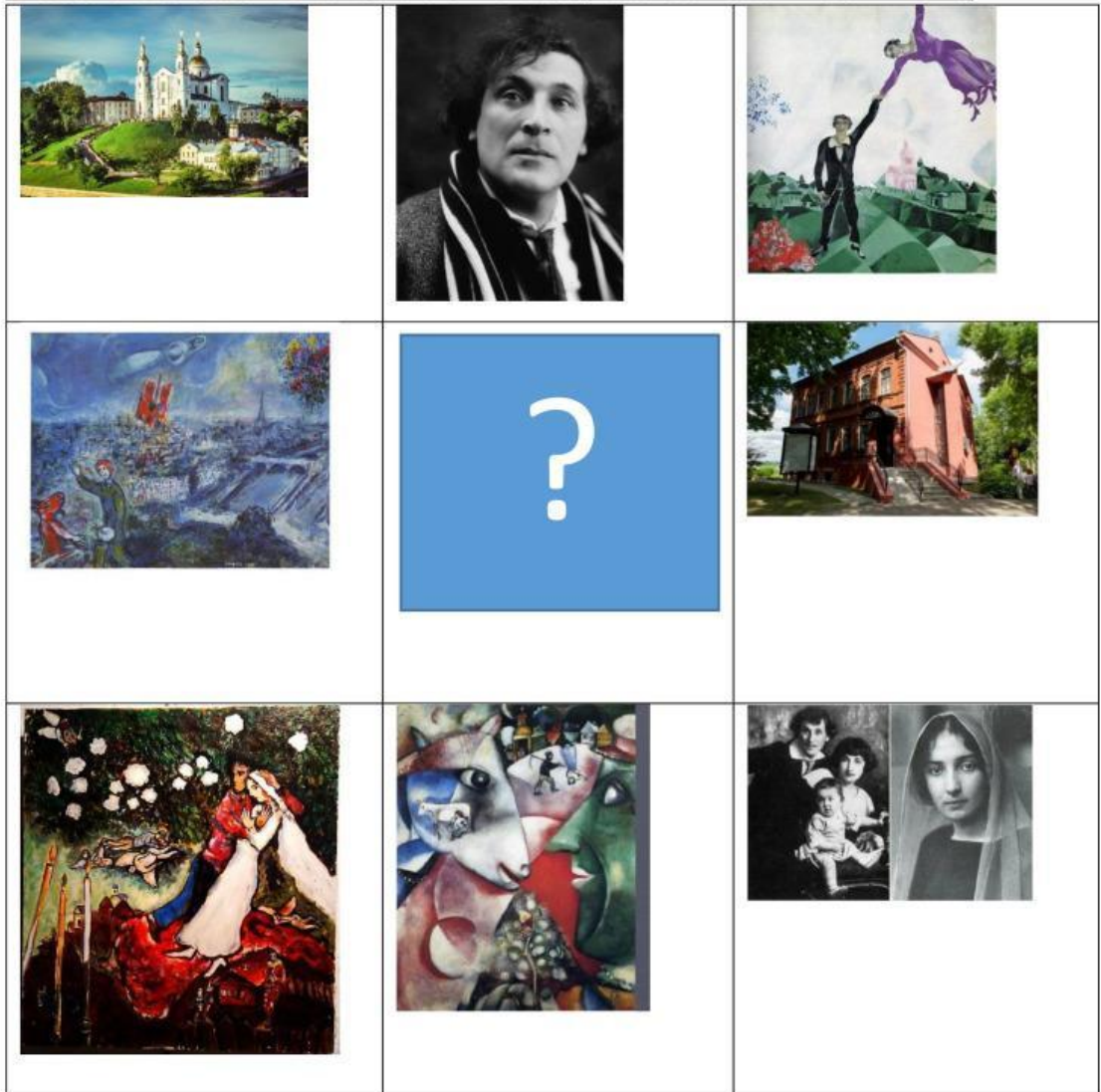


Painting as poetry
