a) Study these charts:

Basic level:

TOO + adjective / adverb	This exam is (not) too difficult.
TOO MUCH + uncountable noun	There is too much pollution.
TOO MANY + plural noun	On this road there are too many cars.
adjective / adverb + ENOUGH	This box is (not) big enough .
ENOUGH + noun	We have enough food and chips.

Advanced level:

TOO MUCH + adjective + uncountable noun	There is too much dark paint in this picture.
TOO MANY + adjective + plural noun	There are too many bad people in this neighbourhood.
ENOUGH + adjective + noun	We have enough cold beer.

Compare these examples:

We have enough cold beer.

- = We have **enough** **beer** (there is a sufficient amount of it).
- We are talking about **quantity**: “cold beer” **defines** the kind of beer we have.

We have cold enough beer.

- = The beer is **cold** **enough**.
- We are talking about a **quality**: “cold” **describes** the beer we have.

b) Choose the correct option:
