- a) a non-fictional film or tv program that provides a factual account of real-life events, subjects, or issues. These often include interviews, archival footage, and expert analysis to inform and educate viewers
- b) a type of tv show that provides in-depth analysis, discussion, and coverage of social issues, and relevant topics; often includes interviews, panel discussions, and investigative reports
- c) a serialized drama that typically focuses on the lives and relationships of multiple characters. These are known for their melodramatic and emotionally charged storytelling
- d) focuses on showcasing various aspects of wildlife and the natural world; often includes documentaries, footage of animals in their natural habitats, and discussions about conservation efforts
- e) a genre of tv program that generates suspense, tension, and excitement through its plot, often involving high-stakes situations, danger, and intrigue
- f) a program that features contestants participating in various games, challenges, or competitions to win prizes or rewards
- g) program or film that blends elements of true events and romanticized fictional elements to enhance storytelling and entertainment value
- h) program that presents real-life events and interactions, often involving ordinary people in unscripted situations

- i) These programs inform viewers about developments in various areas, including politics, economics, social issues, and more; typically presented in a concise and factual manner
- j) a comedy program that consists of a series of short comedic scenes or sketches, often unrelated to each other
- k) a genre of tv program or film that is set in a particular historical period. These often depict historical events, social customs, and manners of the time
- l) a collection of related television episodes that follow a common theme, storyline, or set of characters. Each episode can generally stand alone and doesn't necessarily rely on the others for continuity.
- m) revolves around solving crimes, mysteries, or puzzles
- n) a tv show where participants answer questions on various topics to test their knowledge
- o) a comedic television show that typically follow a consistent setting and recurring characters, allowing for ongoing comedic storylines
- p) a type of tv show where the storyline and characters continue from one episode to the next; missing an episode can lead to difficulty in understanding subsequent episodes
