TAG QUESTIONS

A tag question is a small question that is attached, or "tagged", to the end of a sentence. Rather than repeat the main verb, a form of "be" or another auxiliary verb or modal is used in the tag.

You're interested in saving money, _____ you?

This offer is too good to miss, _____ it?

"Investing in your future is something you value, _____ you?"

Uses: Tag questions are used to ask for agreement or to ask for things, favors, or new information.



asking for a favor	You couldn't lend me some money, could you?
asking for information	You don't know where to vacation this year, do you?
asking for agreement	That dress looks great on her, doesn't it?

Exceptions:

- After "let's", the tag begins with "shall".

Let's invite the neighbors over for dinner on the weekend, _____ we?

- Use "aren't I" in tags to mean "I am not".

I'm on time, _____? (correct)

I'm on time, am't I? (incorrect)

- Use "will" or "would" with imperative sentences (commands).

Wait here until I return, will you? Wait here until I return, would you?
