

Wild camping in the Cairngorms National Park



Wild camping is done in small numbers and only for two or three nights in any one place. You may wild camp in the National Park if you do so responsibly.

There are a range of lovely campsites across the Park which can offer the best of both worlds – a remote feeling and the back-to-nature camping experience and the appropriate facilities for your needs, ensuring you are being a responsible camper and helping us keep the Cairngorms a special place.

Advice on wild camping:

- Camp in small numbers only and don't stay in the same spot for more than two or three nights.
- Do not light a campfire, be prepared and take a gas stove.
- Take all your litter away.
- Consider your campsite location - keep away from fields of crops or farm animals and keep away from buildings, roads, and historic structures.
- Take care to avoid disturbing wildlife such as deer, capercaillie and grouse.
- If it is busy, move on and find a quiet spot for yourself.
