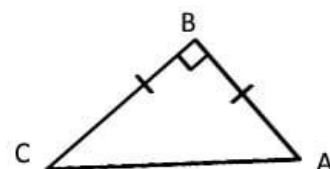


Middle 3 (Trigonometry)
