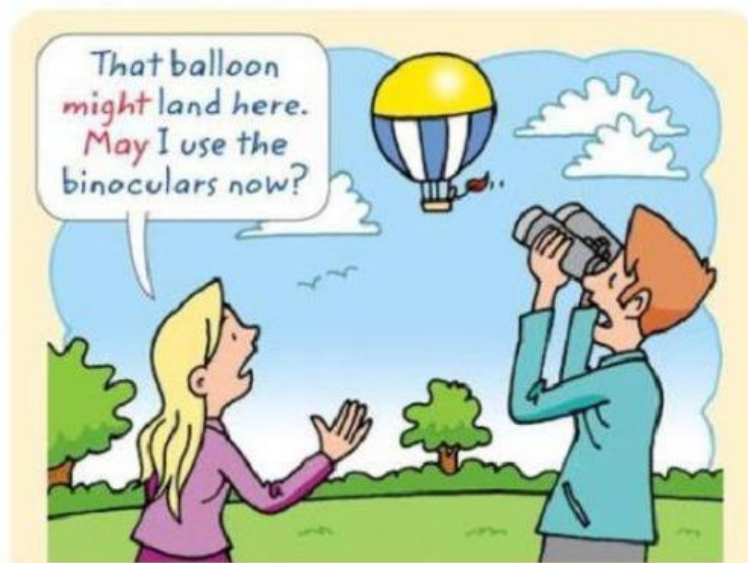


MAY AND MIGHT TO EXPRESS PROBABILITY

May means “puede” and is used for a higher probability that something happens.

Might means “podría” and is used for a lower probability that something happens.



Example:



There is no traffic.

I **might** arrive to the party on time.
