Airports will now have lie detectors

In several airports in Europe, passengers will be administered lie detector tests powered **1** _____ in addition to their normal security steps, according to a press release about the new initiative.

A new EU-backed project called iBorderCtrl **2** _____ at border checkpoints in Hungary, Latvia and Greece – three countries that border non-EU nations – for a trial this month.

The program works as follows: **3** _____ will answer questions from a computer-animated border guard through a webcam **4** _____ during the lie-detection process.

"It will ask the person to confirm their name, age and date of birth, and it will ask them things like **5** _____ and who is funding the trip," Keeley Crockett, one of the experts involved in the project, told CNN about the screening process.

A press release about the program states the virtual border guard will analyse the traveller's micro-expressions to gauge whether they may be lying, with human border guards overseeing the entire process and stepping in if a security risk is detected.
