nice - the nicest
late - the latest

one-syllable adjectives ending in consonant, vowel, consonant, double the last consonant and take -est
fat - the fattest
big - the biggest

two-syllable adjectives ending in -y changes to -i
nasty - the nastiest
easy - the easiest

irregular forms
good - the best
bad - the worst
far - further/the furthest

long adjectives

two-syllable adjectives not ending in -y and three or more syllables adjectives use most

modern - the most modern
dangerous - the most dangerous
