C = Consonant

- Words with the VC/CV syllable pattern have closed syllables, or a consonant at the end of the first syllable.
- Words with the VC/CV syllable pattern have a consonant at the beginning of the second syllable.
- In VC/CV words, there are two consonants in the middle of a two-syllable word. Divide VC/CV words between the two consonants to pronounce the word correctly.
