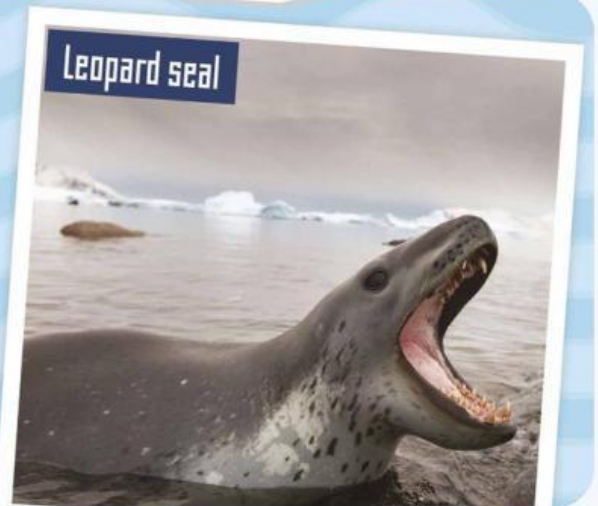

Leopard seal

Leopard seals hunt in the freezing, blue water around Antarctica. They're very successful predators. They use their long, sharp teeth to catch penguins and fish. Leopard seals have dark gray **fur**, and this helps to camouflage them while they **hunt**. The fur also keeps the seals warm on land. In the water, a thick **layer** of fat below their skin does the same job. The fat also helps them through the long, hard Antarctic winters. Leopard seals can survive for two months without eating.
