

Make a Compound Sentence

Use 'and', 'but' or 'or' to join clauses

Kate's teacher has asked her to improve her work by joining her simple sentences using 'or', 'but' or 'and' to make a compound sentence. Can you help her by turning her sentences into compound sentences?

Remember to take out the first full stop and the second capital letter. E.g. Jake was at the park. It was sunny.

Jake was at the park and it was sunny.



1. John went to the shop. He bought some sweets.

2. Should Rachel buy sweets? Should she buy chocolate?

3. Terry missed the bus. He still managed to get to school on time.

4. Jennifer might win the competition. Tracy could win too.

5. Peter needed to wear sun cream. He had forgotten to pack it.

6. In football class, James learnt to dribble the ball. He learnt how to pass.

7. The children went to fly a kite. It wasn't windy outside.

8. The teacher sat at his desk. He marked some books.
