As rain falls into lakes and river this can cause water pollution. Acid rain can also be responsible for damaging (4).....	The diagram illustrates the acid rain cycle and its harmful effects. It shows the atmosphere where pollutants from factories and cars are released. These pollutants can be transformed into acid particles or combine with water vapor to form acid rain. The acid rain falls as either dry deposition (dust, soot, ash) or wet deposition (acid rain and snow). The diagram shows the acid rain falling on land (forests, soil) and water (lakes, rivers, oceans). The effects include plants dying, soil becoming more acidic, and water bodies becoming more acidic. Humans are using (21)..... more resources than the Earth can replenish each year.

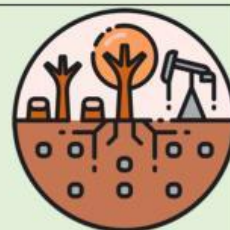
This leads to pollution, land degradation, soil erosion and (22).....

The build up of (25)..... into the atmosphere have led to changes in the world's climates.

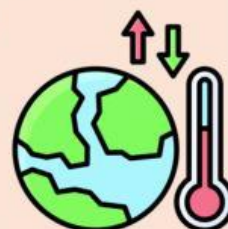
The cause of this can be found in carbon emissions and the combustion of (26).....
