RANAU LAKE

Lake Ranau is the second largest lake in Sumatra after Lake Toba. This lake is located on the border of South Ogan Komering Ulu Regency, South Sumatra Province and West Lampung Regency, Lampung Province. This lake was created by a large earthquake and volcanic eruption from a volcano which created a large basin.

Geographically, the topography of Lake Ranau is located in hills with valleys. This makes Lake Ranau have cool weather. The lake is famous for fishermen looking for fish such as tilapia, kepor, kepiat, and harongan

Right in the middle of the lake there is an island called Marisa Island. There are hot springs there which are often used by local residents and tourists who come to the island, there are waterfalls and accommodation. This lake is also a mainstay tourist attraction in South Ogan Komering Ulu Regency. At Lake Ranau, tourism and sports activities are often held. Among the Motorcycle Trail Adventure activities are entitled JASS (Jelajah Alam Serasan Seandanan) and Touring Road Bike (Sriwijaya Ranau Grand Fondo).

There are many destinations for visitors to Lake Ranau, namely Wisma PT Pusri (South Sumatra), Sinangkalan Beach (South Sumatra), Pelangi Beach (South Sumatra), Bidadari Beach (South Sumatra), Hot Springs Tourism (South Sumatra), Icon Ranau (Sumatra South) and Lombok Tourism (Lampung).
