<b>A</b>	<b>Planting more trees</b>  Last week, I took part in my neighbourhood's Plant-a-Tree Campaign. I have learned that planting trees is one of the easiest ways to save the environment. Trees make our air cleaner and less polluted because they can trap dust. Besides that, trees absorb carbon dioxide and release oxygen into the atmosphere. All living things need oxygen in order to survive.
<b>B</b>	<b>Using less plastic</b>  Using plastic is not good for the environment because it often ends up in oceans and landfills. Plastic takes hundreds of years to degrade. It also releases harmful toxins into the environment. Nowadays, I use my own stainless-steel straw instead of a plastic one. I also bring my own reusable bag when I go shopping. Not only that, I have stopped buying bottled water. Instead, I bring my own reusable water bottle.

It's important to sort them as each recycling material is used in a different way.
