a very large type of animal that used to live millions of years ago

an animal whose body is covered with scales and whose blood changes temperature

any member of the class of animals (including man) in which the females feed the young with their own milk

a type of animal with no spine, a hard outer skin, legs with bones joined together, and a body divided into different parts, for example a spider, crab, or ant

an animal that lives both on land and in water but must produce its eggs in water

a small creature with six legs, for example a bee or a fly
